Century – Key Stage 4 English Home Learning

I am writing to inform you of the changes we are making to Key Stage 4 English home learning.

We have recently purchased Century Software to help students revise for English. This is new 'AI' Technology in which the students are put onto an independent learning journey to help target the gaps and misconceptions in their English knowledge. Students will be required to complete three tasks a week for their home learning using the Century software, this will replace their current Quizlet home learning. Students will sign up for the software in their English lessons and will be instructed on how to use the programme by their English teacher. The tasks they have to complete are called 'nuggets' and will either be set by their teacher or by the AI software that monitors their responses.

The award-winning technology will support student revision, particularly for English, as the two subject GCSE course (English Language and English Literature) has a vast amount of content that must be continually revised over the two-year period. Century is a web-based App. Students should go to ***app.century.tech*** and login from here.

You may also use the learning materials with them if you are unfamiliar with the work yourself; there is always a choice of video or learning cards.

Use the parent portal to look at their progress.

Set rewards for them if they complete a manageable amount of work.
