Home learning at the academy is closely aligned to the curriculum students are taught in lessons.

Home Learning tasks are always designed to help students either prepare for key assessments or to respond to information gathered from assessments.

Home learning tasks are set on Class Charts so it can be monitored by parents.





Half Term 1 – September - students to be set English, Maths and Science to be set once per week.

Half Term 1 – October - English, Maths and Science to be set once per week plus Geography and History once per fortnight.

Half Term 2 – November - English, Maths and Science to be set once per week plus all other subjects once per fortnight.

Attitude to Learning



Grade	Examples (NB: this is not a checklist)
Grade 1 - Excellent I was a role model and increased the opportunities to learn in the lesson	 I was Spotlighted by the teacher. I actively sought feedback from teacher. I did not require the teacher to prompt behaviour. I embraced challenge in the lesson. I was overtly respectful to peers and/or teacher.
Grade 2 – Good I took opportunities to learn in the lesson	 I was prepared and ready to learn. I engaged with tasks without delay. I remained attentive throughout the lesson. I responded with resilience and kindness (gratitude) to feedback.
Grade 3 - Inconsistent I missed opportunities to learn in the lesson	 My attention drifted which will have required prompting from the teacher. My behavioural choices required teacher intervention I avoided challenge, and/or was slow to ask for teacher support. I may have been slow to respond to feedback I received a warning on Class Charts.
Grade 4 - Poor I prevented opportunities for others to learn in the lesson	 I caused others' attention to distracted from learning I did not correct behaviour after spotlighting of role models / teacher intervention I was overtly unkind to peers and/or teacher, for example refusal to follow instructions. I was removed from the lesson by On Call.
